

## We are delighted to present the January to July 2013 programme of music courses at Benslow Music.

Regular guests will find all the old favourites, but we have also created some new courses which we hope will capture your attention.

Our string quartet programme includes the first of three Allegri Quartet courses between June 2013 and early 2014 which will be devoted to Beethoven. Students will be taught as usual - and there's no obligation to play anything by Beethoven - but each course will be extended to encompass two public concerts and a talk so that we'll have a chance to hear all sixteen quartets.

For string players without musical partners, we introduce our new String Chamber Music Speed Dating course. The idea is that under the guidance of expert tutors students share a session or half-session with new musical acquaintances before moving on. We hope that it will be genuinely productive as well as great fun.

We have expanded our one-day course programme to include practical sessions on reed making for oboists and on harpsichord maintenance, and there's an opportunity for singers to explore Gregorian chant in a course devoted to Easter Alleluyas. There's a new song accompaniment course for pianists, and our unique baroque opera course becomes an annual event, this time devoted to a staging of Purcell's The Fairy Queen. Virtuoso violinist Darragh Morgan leads a course for players of diploma standard and a range of new courses helps prepare candidates for Grades I to 7 piano.

Our excellent food, comfortable accommodation, glorious gardens and home from home friendliness make attending a Benslow Music course an experience to remember. Whether you are an old friend or have only just discovered us, we look forward to welcoming you.

## YOUNG PEOPLE'S RATES

Benslow Standard - Everyone

Guests who were under 27 years of age on I January 2013 are entitled to an automatic 25% discount on the basic Residential or Non-residential price of any residential course. Proof of age required. **This offer does not apply to room supplements, nor to courses lasting a single day or less.** 

Full time students and in many instances all those under the age of 26 are entitled to attend most Benslow Music concerts free. Full time students are also admitted to the Roderick Swanston Lectures free of charge.

## **Arriving and departing**

Normally we ask guests to check in after about 4 pm on the first day of a course. When this is different the course description should say so.

Your welcome pack includes your key, vital information about Benslow Music and a course timetable. Tea, coffee and cake is available until the bar opens.

Dinner is served at 7 pm (except on days when we are hosting a public concert, when it is usually served at 6.30 pm) and is preceded by a brief welcome in the bar.

If you are likely to arrive late, please let us know as soon as you can and we will make arrangements to set a meal aside for you.

Most courses end with tea and cakes at 4 pm on the final day, although the time can slightly vary from course to course.

Day courses begin at 10 am. We break for an hour's lunch at 1 pm and end not after 5 pm.

## Sleep well

You might prefer a traditional Victorian bedroom with a lovely pine floor and antique furnishings, or you might feel more at home in a more modern room. Whatever your choice, we offer a varied range of comfortable single and double en-suite and standard rooms. No more than three standard rooms share a bathroom and all standard rooms have a wash basin. ## Tickle the tastebuds and fill the tank

All of our food is prepared freshly on the premises, and our chefs May, Michelle and Tara take immense pride in offering the highest possible standard of cooking. Our friendly team of servers are also on hand to do everything they can to maximise your enjoyment. Lunch (except on Sundays) and breakfast are buffet-style meals but you will enjoy at-table service for dinner and for the traditional British Sunday roast.

We try to source local products when we can and sometimes we use produce from our own garden. We also buy official Fairtrade products and all our meat is Red Tractor assured and so originates from British farms

We will happily cater for a range of special diets but only if we know in advance and only on moral or health grounds. Unfortunately we cannot provide kosher or halal meats.

The Bar, often tended by the popular Ken, is open for business at lunchtime and in the evenings and is always available to residents and visitors as a lounge area. A television is available in the Garden Room extension.



## The Gardens

Our beautiful gardens are very much an integral part of the Benslow Music experience and provide an inviting space in which to relax, absorb information and re-gather energies between sessions You are very welcome to wander around. If Jif, our gardener, happens to be around and if he's not too busy doing something else he will happily tell you about any plant species on the site and no doubt offer off the cuff tips for your own garden.

The wilder and wooded parts of the grounds, which contain some magnificent tree specimens, are just as beautiful as the carefully tended parts, but please take care not to get too close to the bee hives.



## **Our Music Facilities**

As far as we know we are the only residential college in the United Kingdom entirely devoted to year-round short music courses. As such we are able to offer unrivalled specialist facilities. There are ten designated rehearsal and practice rooms which include two halls suitable for larger ensembles and for public events. Each space includes at least one piano. Our piano stock includes well-maintained Steinway, Yamaha, Steinweg-Grotrian and Bechstein baby grand pianos and a full size Welmar grand. We also possess a fine Goble harpsichord modelled on a 1727 Christian Zell original as well as virginals, a spinet and a clavichord. Our keyboard stock is completed by a restored Broadwood square piano dating from the 1820s.

We also possess a state of the art hi-fi system.

## What if I'm not good enough?

Many potential course members are worried by this thought. But the truth is that at Benslow Music nobody is not good enough. We specify a range of abilities for each course and although this range can sometimes be wide our tutors are experts at giving equal attention and respect to everyone, no matter what your level of attainment is. It secures entitlement to a refund of all monies paid (excluding the initial deposit and the insurance premium itself) in the event of a subsequent cancellation made under specified conditions (available from us on request). Insurance does not provide cover once the course has started and relates only to the insured party. We will normally ask for documentary evidence of a reason to cancel.

Our insurance does not cover loss, damage or theft of personal belongings, travel to and from the Trust, cancellation due to holiday commitments or any other reason for cancellation other than those noted in the conditions. Cancellations must be made in writing prior to the start of the course. No refund is due if a cancellation is made when only a deposit has been paid.


